# A Good Use of Your Money and Time: **Helping the Less Fortunate**

You may think the most important reason to save and manage money is to take good care of yourself. It is, but you should also consider using some of your money (and some of your time) to help others less fortunate than you in your town or around the world.



"People who give generously of their time and their money get tremendous amounts of satisfaction in return," said Liz Kelderhouse, an FDIC Community Affairs Officer. "You'll feel great knowing you're making a difference, and you'll have a better appreciation of what you're fortunate enough to have."

How can you get more involved sharing your time and money with others? Here are some ideas:

- 1. Donate part of your allowance or gift money to a charity you admire.
- 2. Ask friends and family to donate to a charity instead of giving you birthday or holiday gifts.
- 3. Join or start an organization at school or in your community that helps others.
- 4. Coordinate with friends and parents on a car wash, a toy or food collection, or some other event for a local charity.
- 5. Volunteer to mow the lawn, rake leaves or handle another chore for an ill or elderly neighbor.
- 6. Help your parents when they volunteer for a good cause or donate items to a charity.
- 7. Participate in a walk or run that raises money for a charity.
